A Sea Turtle's First Trip

- ① Sea turtles begin life on sandy beaches. A mother turtle digs a hole, lays eggs, and covers them with sand. She returns to the ocean. Weeks later, tiny hatchlings break out of the eggs, usually at night.
- ② At night, hatchlings crawl toward the brightest open space, which is often the moonlit ocean. They use their flippers to move over the sand. Moving at night may help them avoid some birds that hunt during the day.
- ③ Once in the water, hatchlings swim away from the shore. They may float among seaweed, where food and hiding places can be found. Only some young turtles survive, because fish, crabs, and other animals may eat them.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Literal question: Where do hatchlings float after they enter the water? Answer: They may float among seaweed.

Inferential question: Why might seaweed be a helpful place for hatchlings? Answer: It can give them food and hiding places.
