A Busy Beehive

- ① Worker honey bees leave the hive to find flowers. A bee drinks nectar with its long tongue and stores it in a special stomach. Yellow pollen sticks to the bee's hairy body as it moves from flower to flower.
- ② Back at the hive, the bee passes nectar to another worker. The workers place the nectar in wax cells. They fan their wings to dry the nectar. When it becomes honey, bees cover each cell with a wax cap.
- ③ Inside the hive, nurse bees feed baby bees, called larvae. Other workers clean the hive and guard its entrance. The queen lays eggs. All of these jobs help the colony stay safe, clean, and supplied with food.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Worker bees visit flowers, drink nectar with their long tongues, and carry it in special stomachs. In the hive, workers put nectar into wax cells and fan it until it becomes honey. Nurse bees feed larvae while other bees clean and guard the hive.
