How Beavers Build Lodges

- ① Beavers use branches, mud, and stones to build homes called lodges. A lodge may sit in a pond or beside a stream. The water around it can help keep land animals away from the beavers.
- ② First, a beaver cuts small trees with its strong teeth. It carries branches to a shallow place in the water. Then it piles branches together and presses mud between them. The mud helps hold the lodge in place.
- ③ Inside the lodge, beavers make a dry room above the water. An underwater door leads into the lodge, so beavers can swim home. In winter, thick walls of branches and mud help the lodge stay warmer.
