A Seed Starts Growing

- ① Have you seen a bean grow in a cup? A seed is like a tiny package. Inside are a baby plant and stored food. The seed coat is a hard cover that helps protect the baby plant.
- ② When a seed gets water, its coat softens. The baby plant uses stored food first, much like you use a snack for energy. A root grows down to take in water from the soil.
- ③ Later, a shoot grows up toward light. Leaves open and make food using light, air, and water. This is why a plant in a dark closet cannot keep growing well, even if you water it.

3	Think about what happens in a dark closet. How does that help you understand why a plant cannot keep growing well there?	Plants need light to make food, so a plant in a dark closet cannot keep growing well.
