A Beaver's Pond

- ① Beavers live near streams, where they use branches, mud, and stones to build dams. A dam slows moving water. Water gathers behind the dam and forms a pond. Beavers often build their homes, called lodges, in these ponds.
- ② The pond may give beavers a safer place to live because water can keep some land animals away from the lodge. It also changes the stream. Some fish, frogs, and insects can use the quieter water as a home.
- ③ Over time, plants may grow along the pond's edge. These plants can give animals food and cover. A beaver pond is an amazing place to watch. The pond can become a habitat for many living things.
