1	What happened first, next, and last in the story?	First, Nia saw Mr. Lee struggling to cover his lettuce. Next, she helped him cover it. Last, they planted the tomato plants together after the rain.
2	What problem did Nia notice, and what did she do about it?	Mr. Lee was struggling to cover his lettuce before the rain. Nia helped him spread a cloth over it.
3	What lesson did Nia learn?	Taking time to help someone can make a hard day easier for everyone.
