Nia's Red Kite

- ① On Saturday, Nia brought her red kite to the hill behind her apartment. A steady wind lifted the kite high. Then the string slipped from Nia's hand and caught in the branches of a tall oak tree.
- ② Nia tugged gently, but the kite only shook. She wanted to pull harder, yet she feared the string would tear. Her brother Leo found a long stick, but it was too short to reach the branches.
- ③ Nia asked the park gardener for help. The gardener used a tall ladder and carefully freed the string. Nia held the kite again, and she and Leo ran down the hill to fly it in an open field.

1	What is Nia's central conflict, or main problem?	Nia's kite is caught in a tall oak tree, and she cannot reach it.
2	What are two events that show Nia cannot get the kite down by herself?	Nia tugs gently, but the kite only shakes. Leo's long stick is too short to reach the branches.
3	Which event solves Nia's central conflict?	The park gardener uses a tall ladder and frees the kite string.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Ava's central conflict is that she cannot find her library book before it is due. She looks in her backpack, but the book is not there. She asks her dad to check the car.
