YOUR JOB As you read, circle Leo’s reading question. Underline one clue that helps answer his question.

The Missing Mitten

- ① Before reading “The Missing Mitten,” Leo looked at the cover. It showed a snowy yard and one red mitten. Leo remembered losing his own glove at recess. He wondered, “Where might the mitten be, and who will find it?”
- ② On the first page, a squirrel carried the mitten toward an oak tree. Leo underlined that clue. He read on to learn whether the squirrel needed a warm nest or was taking the mitten to someone else.
- ③ At the end, Leo learned that the squirrel had found two cold baby squirrels. It used the mitten to line their nest. Leo’s question helped him notice clues about why the squirrel carried it away.
