#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	The word see sounds like sea. What does see mean in the first paragraph? Which words help you know?	See means look with the eyes. "Watch the tall bird" helps show this.
2	In paragraph 2, blue and blew sound alike. What does blew mean? Which words help you know?	Blew means moved by wind. "The wind" and "petals" help show this.
3	In paragraph 3, how do the clues show that rode and road have different meanings?	Rode means traveled by bike. Road means the path they traveled on.
