The Roof Garden

- ① At Maple School, a small garden grows on the sunny roof. Classes planted lettuce, beans, and marigolds in deep boxes. A tall fence keeps balls from rolling near the plants, and a hose carries water upstairs.
- ② Each week, students take turns pulling weeds and checking the soil. When the lettuce is ready, the cafeteria uses it for salads. Bees visit the marigolds, which helps the flowers make seeds.
- ③ During hot days, the plants shade part of the roof. This can keep the roof cooler. Students say the garden is a good place to watch insects and learn how food grows.
