Our School Garden

- ① A school garden gives children a place to learn outdoors. Students can plant seeds, pull weeds, and water young plants. They watch stems grow toward sunlight. The garden also gives butterflies and bees flowers to visit.
- ② A school garden can grow food for the cafeteria. In spring, students may plant lettuce, peas, and carrots. Later, cooks can use some vegetables in salads or soups. Sharing garden food helps students see where meals begin.
- ③ Working in a school garden teaches students to care for living things. Garden jobs must be done often, even when plants are small. Students check soil, add water when needed, and remove weeds that crowd plants. These actions help the garden stay healthy.
