Seed Swap Plan

- ① Our class will hold a seed swap for families on Friday after recess. The event will be in the school garden by the blue gate. We want families to trade seeds and learn what can grow in our neighborhood.
- ② First, bring a small bag of seeds you can share. Next, place your bag on the matching plant table. Then, choose one new kind of seed and write its name on the trade list.
- ③ Our garden helpers will set out labels, pencils, and paper bags before the swap. Families may ask helpers about sun, water, and planting times. This plan gives everyone a place, a time, and clear steps for trading.
