A Garden for Butterflies

- ① A school garden can be a helpful place for butterflies. Butterflies drink nectar from many flowers. They also need leaves where caterpillars can eat and grow. A garden with different plants gives butterflies food and shelter.
- ② Gardeners can choose plants that give butterflies what they need. First, they can plant bright flowers in sunny spots. Zinnias and coneflowers have nectar that butterflies sip. Next, they can add milkweed, which monarch caterpillars eat.
- ③ A butterfly garden also helps people learn outdoors. Students can watch insects visit flowers and notice changes over time. By planting and caring for a garden, a school can make a safe place for butterflies and a living place to study.
