### A Report on Beavers

- ① Today I am reporting on beavers, animals that shape the places where they live. A beaver has thick brown fur, webbed back feet, and a wide, flat tail. It uses strong front teeth to cut small trees and branches. These body parts help the beaver swim, carry wood, and build a safe home near water.
- ② First, a beaver gathers sticks, mud, and stones near a stream. It piles the materials into a dam, which slows the moving water. Behind the dam, a pond can form. The beaver may build a lodge in the pond. Its underwater entrance helps protect it from animals that might try to enter the dry lodge.
- ③ Finally, beavers do more than make homes for themselves. Their dams can create ponds where fish, frogs, ducks, and insects find food or shelter. The ponds can also hold water after rain. By building carefully with natural materials, beavers change a flowing stream into a habitat that can help many living things, including nearby animals, survive.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

Spoken sample: Today I am reporting on sea otters, animals that help keep kelp forests healthy. Sea otters have thick fur that traps air and helps keep them warm in cold ocean water. They float on their backs and use rocks to crack open hard shells, such as sea urchins. When resting, they may wrap themselves in long, brown kelp so currents do not carry them away. Sea urchins eat kelp, so otters that eat urchins can keep too much kelp from being eaten. Sea otters matter because healthy kelp forests give many ocean animals places to find food and hide.
