### Peregrines Above the Streets

- ① High above busy streets, peregrine falcons may nest on tall buildings. A building ledge can feel like a cliff, the rocky place where these birds usually nest. From a high perch, an adult can watch for pigeons and other birds. Peregrines have sharp eyesight, so they can spot movement far below. Cities also offer many ledges that shelter eggs from heavy rain.
- ② When a peregrine sees prey, it may climb higher and then fold its wings for a fast dive. This dive is called a stoop. The bird does not grab prey with its beak during the dive. Instead, it strikes with its feet, which have long, curved claws. A quick strike can surprise another bird, but the falcon must pull up carefully to avoid crashing.
- ③ Living in a city is not always safe for peregrines. Glass windows can be hard for birds to see, and a collision can injure them. Some cities protect nest sites by placing a box on a tall building. The box gives chicks a dry place before they can fly. People may watch a nest camera, but they should not disturb the birds near the ledge.
