A Visit to the Tide Pools

- ① At low tide, Maya walked beside a rocky shore. “Where did the water go?” she said. Her guide pointed to small pools between the rocks. They could see sea stars, tiny fish, and green seaweed. The pools held many things to look at, but Maya knew she should not touch wild animals at all.
- ② A hermit crab moved slowly across the sand. It could not grow a shell of its own, so it found an empty shell for its home. When the crab felt worried, it pulled its body inside. “They may hide again when a bird flies near,” said the guide. Maya watched quietly because the crab needed space.
- ③ The guide explained that tide pools change as the tide returns. Soon, water would cover the rocks again, and the animals could move through a larger space. Maya said she would tell her class where the tide pools were. They would learn why people watch from a careful distance, because wild animals need calm homes.
