A Morning Bird Count

- ① At sunrise, a park ranger began a bird count near a marsh. She carried a clipboard, binoculars, and a small guidebook. A bright blue jay called from an oak tree. Near the water, a heron stood still, waiting for a fish. The ranger wrote each bird's name and location before moving down the trail to another pond.
- ② Bird counts help scientists learn which kinds of birds live in an area. When many people report the same species year after year, scientists can notice changes. For example, fewer water birds may mean that a pond is shrinking or that food is harder to find. Careful reports give researchers useful information about bird habitats.
- ③ Later, the ranger reread her list with a class at the visitor center. The students compared the names in the guidebook with pictures on a screen. One child noticed that a woodpecker had a strong beak for drilling into bark. Another child asked why some birds migrate. The ranger explained that changing weather and food supplies can lead birds to travel.
