Maya Studies Beavers

- ① Maya noticed a muddy dam across a stream near the park. A beaver had built it with sticks, stones, and mud. She wanted to learn more, but "beavers" was a very big topic. Maya chose one smaller topic: how beavers change a stream. A smaller topic helped her think about what information she needed to find.
- ② First, Maya asked, "What happens to the water when a beaver builds a dam?" This question matched her smaller topic because it was about the stream. Next, she asked, "What plants grow near the pond behind a dam?" Looking at water and plants could show ways a beaver changes the place. She planned to find answers in library books and safe nature websites.
- ③ Maya did not ask, "Are beavers nice?" People could give different opinions, and the answer would not explain stream changes. She also did not ask, "Do beavers have fur?" That fact might be interesting, but it did not fit her smaller topic. Before researching, Maya checked each question. She kept questions that could help her learn how a beaver changes a stream.

3	Copy one question Maya kept. What part of her topic does it explore?	Answers may include: "What happens to the water when a beaver builds a dam?" It explores changes to the stream water. OR "What plants grow near the pond behind a dam?" It explores plant changes near the stream.
4	Does "Do beavers have fur?" fit Maya's smaller topic? Explain.	No. It is an interesting fact, but it does not help explain how a beaver changes a stream.
