Maya’s Sea Turtle Sources

- ① Maya is making a poster about sea turtles for science class. She starts with a book called *Ocean Animals for Young Readers*. On page 18, she finds that green sea turtles eat seagrass and algae. Maya writes one short note on her note card: “Green turtles eat seagrass and algae.” She also writes the book title and page number.
- ② Next, Maya uses an educational website called Ocean Facts Online with her teacher nearby. A page on the site explains that hatchlings usually move toward the brightest horizon after leaving the nest. Over the ocean, this light is often from the moon and stars. Maya writes a brief note: “Hatchlings follow bright light toward water.” She records the website name and page title, “Hatchling Basics.”
- ③ Finally, Maya interviews Mr. Diaz, an educator at the Bay Aquarium. She asks, “Which sea turtle is the largest?” Mr. Diaz says that the leatherback is the largest living turtle. Maya writes, “Mr. Diaz, Bay Aquarium: Leatherbacks are the largest sea turtles.” Before she makes her poster, Maya checks that each note has a fact and the source where she found it.
