A Night Trip

- ① On a warm summer night, a female sea turtle digs a nest in sand and lays her eggs. Weeks later, tiny hatchlings break out of the shells. They usually leave the nest at night, when the beach is cooler and some predators are harder to see. But how can hatchlings find the ocean when they have never been there before?
- ② Sea turtles do not follow a parent. Instead, hatchlings move toward the brightest, lowest place they can see. On a natural beach, the open sky over the water is often brighter than the land behind them. This light guides the hatchlings toward the waves. As they crawl, the slope of the beach and the sound of moving water can also help.
- ③ Bright lights near beaches can cause trouble. Hotel lights, streetlights, and porch lights may look brighter than the ocean sky. Confused hatchlings can crawl toward roads or buildings instead of the water. People can help by turning off unneeded lights, closing curtains, and keeping beaches dark during hatching season. Dark beaches give young turtles a safer start.
