How Beavers Make a Home

- ① Beavers are large rodents that live near streams, rivers, and ponds. They use their sharp front teeth to cut small trees and branches. Then they drag the wood into shallow water. A beaver places sticks, mud, and stones across a stream to make a dam. The dam slows the water, so a pond begins to form behind it.
- ② After making a pond, a beaver builds a lodge, which is its home. The lodge may sit in the pond or along its edge. Beavers pile branches and mud into a mound. Inside, they make a dry room above the water. An underwater entrance helps protect the beaver from animals that might try to enter the lodge.
- ③ In autumn, beavers gather extra branches near their lodge. They store these branches underwater, where the food stays fresh longer. During winter, ice may cover the pond, but beavers can swim below the ice to reach their stored food. The pond also gives them a place to escape quickly if danger comes near. By building carefully, beavers make a safer place to live.
