Mina's Red Kite

- ① On a windy Saturday, Mina carried her new red kite to the hill behind the library. She had built it from thin sticks and paper with her grandfather. When she tried to fly it, the kite spun in the grass. Mina's cheeks grew hot. Two younger children watched, and she wanted to pack up and go home.
- ② Then Mina remembered her grandfather saying that a kite needs a steady pull. She took a deep breath and asked the children, Luis and Ava, to help. Mina held the string while Luis ran slowly. Ava noticed a bent stick near the kite's tail. Mina fixed the stick with tape from her bag, even though her hands shook.
- ③ On their next try, the kite lifted above the hill and tugged at the string. Mina laughed and let Luis and Ava take turns holding it. She no longer felt like hiding when something went wrong. Instead, she had asked for help, made a repair, and tried again. Mina learned that staying calm and working with others can solve a hard problem.

2	What two actions help Mina solve her problem?	She asks Luis and Ava to help, and she fixes the kite's bent stick with tape.
3	How does Mina change from the beginning to the end of the story? Use one detail from each part of the story.	At first, Mina feels embarrassed and wants to go home. At the end, she laughs, shares the kite, and keeps trying after a problem.
4	What lesson does Mina learn?	Staying calm and working with others can solve a hard problem.
