Beavers Change Wetlands

- ① Beavers are busy builders that live near ponds, streams, and wetlands. A wetland is land that stays covered with shallow water for all or part of the year. Beavers use branches, mud, and stones to build a dam across moving water. The dam slows the water and can form a pond. This new pond can give beavers a safer place to swim.
- ② A beaver's home is called a lodge. It is often built in the pond, with an underwater entrance that helps protect the beaver from many predators. The pond is also a habitat, or a place where living things find food, water, and shelter. Ducks, frogs, fish, and insects may depend on the wetland habitat. They need its resources to survive.
- ③ Beaver dams can affect an area in several ways. When water spreads into nearby land, new wetland space may appear. This change can provide homes for some animals, but it can also cover plants that grew on dry ground. Scientists observe these changes to understand how beavers shape their environment over time and in different seasons.
