- ③ Back at the bridge, Maya wrapped the dog in her jacket. A silver tag on its collar showed an address nearby. Soon, a family rushed from a yellow house and called the dog Pepper. Their faces brightened when Pepper bounded toward them. Maya walked home beneath the stars. Although her shoes were muddy, she felt proud of their brave little adventure.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	What does hushed mean in the first paragraph? Which words help you know?	Hushed means very quiet. The words “holding their breath” help show that the woods were quiet and still.
2	What does reluctant mean in the first paragraph?	Reluctant means not wanting to do something or feeling unsure about doing it.
3	In the second paragraph, what does Maya's worry began to melt away mean?	It means Maya's worry slowly went away.
4	What does bounded toward them mean in the third paragraph?	It means Pepper ran or jumped quickly and happily toward the family.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

At recess, the playground buzzed like a beehive as children ran and talked. I stood in a long line for the swings. The phrase means the playground was busy and noisy, and the running and talking are clues.
