He used it to make dough for a garden pizza. Later, everyone ate slices under the bright sky as flags fluttered overhead near the gate.

3	What does pear mean in paragraph 2? Use a detail from the paragraph to explain.	Pear means a fruit. It grows on a tree, and the squirrel carries it away.
4	In paragraph 3, which word means a plant, flower or flour? Which word means an ingredient used to make dough?	Flower means a plant. Flour means the ingredient used to make dough.
