Maya's Seed Library

- ① At the city seed library, people borrow packets of seeds instead of books. In spring, Maya chose bean seeds and read the label carefully. It said the plants would grow quickly in warm soil. She learned that reusable means an item can be used again. The library gives out reusable envelopes so less paper is tossed away.
- ② During a rainy week, Maya kept the envelopes indoors. The dry seeds would not be ruined by water. Her uncle said the packets must stay protected, or safe, until planting day. Maya noticed that indoor means inside a building. She placed the packets on a shelf, far from the wet boots outside by the door.
- ③ On planting day, Maya was eager, not reluctant, to dig small holes. She worked with a neighbor who was unfamiliar with gardening, meaning the neighbor did not know much about it. Maya explained each step. They did not hurry or be careless. Instead, they were cautious and checked that every seed was covered with soil at last.
