Sea Otters at Work

- ① Along the Pacific coast, sea otters float among tall kelp plants. Kelp is a kind of large brown algae that grows in cool ocean water. An otter may wrap a strand of kelp around its body before resting. This natural anchor keeps the animal from drifting away while waves move the water below its paws.
- ② Sea otters have extremely dense fur, with far more hairs in a small patch than many other mammals. The fur traps air next to the otter's skin. That air helps the otter stay warm in chilly water. Because otters do not have a thick layer of blubber, clean fur is especially important for their survival.
- ③ To care for its fur, an otter grooms itself again and again. It rubs, rolls, and blows air through the fur. These actions keep the hairs fluffy and able to hold air. Otters also use stones to crack open hard-shelled prey, such as clams or sea urchins, while floating on their backs near the surface.
