Kite in the Oak

- ① On Saturday, Maya carried her yellow kite to the hill behind the library. A warm wind lifted the ribbon tails as she ran. First, the kite rose above the grass, and Maya laughed. Then a stronger gust pulled the string from her hand. The kite sailed over the fence and landed high in an oak tree. Maya hurried to tell Mr. Cole, the librarian.
- ② Mr. Cole brought a long pool skimmer from the storage shed. Maya held the handle while he carefully raised the net toward the branches. At first, the net slipped past the kite. Next, Maya pointed to the ribbon caught on a twig. Mr. Cole moved the net slowly, and the ribbon fell free. The kite dropped into the grass without a tear.
- ③ After that, Maya thanked Mr. Cole and rolled the string around its spool. She decided to fly the kite in the open field across the street, where there were no tall trees. Before she left, she checked the sky and waited for a gentle breeze. Soon, the kite was dancing again, and Maya watched it with both hands on the string.
