A Garden for Our School

- ① Our school should plant a small vegetable garden beside the playground. A garden would give students a place to learn outside. We could watch seeds sprout, measure growing plants, and notice insects. Many vegetables, such as tomatoes and beans, grow from seeds. Seeing these changes would make science lessons feel real for young learners each day.
- ② A garden could also help our cafeteria. Students might grow lettuce, peas, or herbs to taste during a class activity. Fresh vegetables are foods that people can eat as part of healthy meals. Even a small garden can show children where food comes from before it reaches a store. This would help us make thoughtful food choices.
- ③ I think the garden is worth the work it needs. Classes could take turns watering it and pulling weeds. Plants need water, light, and space to grow well, so each class could check the beds often. The garden would make our schoolyard brighter and give students useful jobs. For these reasons, our school should make room for a vegetable garden.
