A Garden Plan

- ① On Tuesday, Room 12 began a plan for a small pollinator garden. First, the class chose a sunny spot beside the fence. Next, they measured the space with a tape measure. Their first plan said, “We will make a garden.” During a class talk, they decided that sentence did not tell enough. They added details about the plants, tools, and helpers.
- ② First, Maya spread dark soil across the bed. Then, Luis tucked tiny milkweed plants into holes and pressed the soil around each stem. After that, Noor carried a watering can and poured a slow stream near the roots. Finally, the group placed a wooden sign at the edge. The sign read, “Please watch for butterflies.” These steps helped readers picture the work in order.
- ③ Before making the final poster, the class checked each sentence. They made sure every sentence began with a capital letter and ended with the right mark. They also changed a long sentence into two shorter sentences, so it was easier to read. Their final poster said, “Our garden gives butterflies food and a place to lay eggs.” The clear poster helped families understand the garden plan.
