Our School Garden

- ① Last Saturday, I helped at our school garden for the first time. Our class wanted to grow food for the cafeteria, but the beds were dry and filled with weeds. I arrived at nine o'clock with gloves, a water bottle, and a small trowel. The cool air smelled like soil after rain, and bees buzzed around the nearby flowers.
- ② First, my partner and I pulled weeds from one bed. We loosened their roots with trowels so we would not damage the young lettuce plants. Next, we carried two heavy watering cans from the faucet and soaked the soil slowly. By lunchtime, the bed looked neat, and green leaves stood up instead of hiding under tangled weeds.
- ③ Finally, we spread straw around the plants to help the soil keep moisture. When our teacher checked the bed, she said the lettuce would have more room, water, and sunlight to grow. I felt proud because our careful work changed a messy space into a useful garden. This experience showed me that small jobs, done together, can help a whole school.
