Peregrines Above the City

- ① On a spring morning, a peregrine falcon may perch on a tall office building and watch the streets below. The bird is not looking for people. It is watching pigeons, starlings, and other small birds. Peregrines once nested mainly on cliffs near open water or fields. A city skyscraper can offer a similar high ledge, with a wide view and a sheltered place for eggs.
- ② Yet city life also brought danger. In the mid-1900s, a pesticide called DDT moved through food chains. When peregrines ate contaminated birds, the chemical caused their eggshells to become thin. Many eggs broke before chicks could hatch. By 1970, peregrine falcons had nearly disappeared from much of the eastern United States. Scientists, governments, and citizens worked to ban DDT and protect nesting sites.
- ③ Today, people in several cities place nest boxes on tall buildings, bridges, and towers. A nest box has gravel or another safe surface so eggs will not roll away. Some sites have cameras that let viewers watch without climbing near the nest. These efforts do not make a wild falcon tame. Instead, they give the birds a safer place to raise young while people learn why the species needs protection.

3	Based on paragraph 2, what does contaminated mean?	Containing DDT or another harmful chemical.
4	How does paragraph 2 connect to paragraph 3?	Paragraph 2 explains the danger that made peregrines rare, and paragraph 3 explains actions people take to help the birds recover.
