COORDINATING

A coordinating conjunction joins equal ideas. Words such as and, but, and or can join these ideas.

SUBORDINATING

A subordinating conjunction begins an idea that depends on the rest of the sentence. Words such as because, although, and when can do this.

Although the lantern flickered, the campers read.
