The Compost Station

- ① At the school garden, a compost station turns food scraps into rich soil. During lunch, students place banana peels, apple cores, and dry leaves in the collection bin. The garden club gives clear directions: do not add plastic, foil, or meat. Careful sorting keeps the pile healthy and makes the station easier to use each day.
- ② Inside the bin, tiny organisms begin decomposition. Bacteria and fungi break down the scraps, but they need air and moisture. Once a week, club members mix the pile with a shovel. This action adds oxygen. The process can take months, depending on the materials and the temperature. Finished compost improves the garden soil for plants.
- ③ Compost has an important job in conservation because it keeps useful materials out of landfills. It also returns nutrients to the ground, where plants can use them. The club posts information near the station so visitors know what belongs there. With attention and cooperation, a small daily habit can support the protection of soil, water, and wildlife.
