Builders of the Stream

- ① Beavers are busy animals that can change the land around a stream. Using branches, mud, and stones, they build dams across moving water. A dam slows the water and can form a pond. Beavers also build lodges, which are homes with underwater entrances. These animals use their strong teeth to cut trees and carry building materials.
- ② The pond behind a beaver dam can become a wetland, a place where land is covered by shallow water. Wetlands give frogs, fish, ducks, and insects places to live. The still water can also help soil settle instead of washing downstream. When heavy rain falls, a wetland may hold some extra water and reduce flooding farther along the stream.
- ③ Beaver dams do not help every place in the same way. A new pond can cover trails, fields, or roads, so people sometimes need to manage the water level. Still, many scientists study beavers because their ponds create habitats and change how water moves through an area. By building dams, beavers affect both nearby animals and people.

2	What is the main idea of paragraph 1? Give two details that support your answer.	Paragraph 1 explains that beavers build dams and lodges that change a stream. They use branches, mud, and stones, and they use strong teeth to cut trees.
3	Summarize paragraph 2. How do the details about animals and rain support its main idea?	Paragraph 2 explains that beaver ponds can form useful wetlands. The wetlands provide homes for animals and can hold extra rainwater, which may reduce flooding.
4	How does paragraph 3 support the main idea of the whole passage?	Paragraph 3 shows that beaver dams affect both people and animals. Ponds can cover roads or fields, but they also create habitats and change water movement.
