Why Beaver Dams Matter

- ① Beavers are known for cutting branches and placing wood, mud, and stones across moving water. This wall is called a dam. When a dam slows a stream, water can spread behind it and form a pond. The pond gives beavers a deeper place to swim. It also makes it harder for many land animals to reach a beaver's lodge, or home.
- ② A pond does more than protect beavers. Its water can provide homes for fish, frogs, turtles, and insects. Plants may grow along the pond's edge, where birds can find food and nesting places. The dam can also slow rushing water. During heavy rain, the pond may hold some water for a time instead of letting all of it flow downstream at once.
- ③ Beaver dams can change a small stream, but they are not built simply to make a pond for every animal. Beavers build dams mainly to create safer water near their homes. The ponds and slower water can also change the land nearby. For this reason, a beaver's work can affect an entire stream area, not only its own lodge.
