### The Torn River

- ① On Thursday, Maya carried her cardboard river map to the school library. Her class would use it during the town-history fair that afternoon. Near the door, a gust from an open window lifted the map. It slid across the floor and caught on a chair leg. A long tear split the paper river. Maya stared at it, thinking, "Everyone will see that I ruined it."
- ② At first, Maya wanted to hide the map in her backpack. Then she remembered how carefully her partner, Luis, had painted the tiny boats. "I need to fix this," Maya said. She found clear tape, blue paper, and scissors in the art bin. Luis arrived and offered to help. Together, they placed blue paper behind the tear and taped the edges. The river looked bumpy, but it stayed together.
- ③ When visitors gathered around the display, Maya pointed to the repaired river. She explained that the blue patch showed where a spring flood had changed the town's banks long ago. The patch was not part of the original plan, yet it helped the map tell a clearer story. After the fair, Maya thanked Luis. She felt proud because she had faced a problem instead of giving up.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

At the next fair, Maya saw that the labels had blown off her display. "I can make new ones," she told Luis, though she worried that visitors would be confused. She used scrap paper to write clear labels and taped them beside each part of the map. The labels helped visitors understand, showing the theme topic of perseverance.

Accept responses that accurately identify the torn map as the conflict and use plot details to explain its repair. For the theme question, accept perseverance or teamwork when the student supports the idea with specific evidence from Maya's response.
