## REAL ENDING

You can split the word into a root word and -s, -ed, or -ing. The ending adds meaning, such as more than one or happened before.

painted = paint + -ed

## LETTERS IN ROOT

The last letters may look like an ending, but they are part of the root word. Do not split the word.

wing is one root word, not w + -ing.

| # | ITEM    | CATEGORY      | WHY                                               |
|---|---------|---------------|---------------------------------------------------|
| 1 | jumped  | <b>ENDING</b> | jump + -ed; -ed shows the action happened before. |
| 2 | dogs    | <b>ENDING</b> | dog + -s; -s shows more than one dog.             |
| 3 | ring    | <b>ROOT</b>   | ring is a root word, not r + -ing.                |
| 4 | running | <b>ENDING</b> | run + -ing; -ing shows an action happening now.   |
| 5 | sled    | <b>ROOT</b>   | sled is a root word, not sl + -ed.                |
| 6 | class   | <b>ROOT</b>   | class is a root word, not clas + -s.              |
| 7 | helped  | <b>ENDING</b> | help + -ed; -ed shows the action happened before. |
| 8 | dress   | <b>ROOT</b>   | dress is a root word, not dres + -s.              |

Accept any explanation that names the deciding feature from the rule box for the chosen item.

**PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)**

- **ENDING:** swims
- **ROOT:** crab

**Challenge:** The birds floated across the pond. Root: float. Ending: -ed. The ending tells that the floating happened in the past.

For Part 2, accept explanations that correctly identify the root and inflectional ending, or correctly explain that the final letters cannot be separated from the root. Part 3 answers will vary.
