The Monarch Migration

- ① Each fall, millions of monarch butterflies begin a remarkable trip from Canada and the United States to mountain forests in central Mexico. The journey is lengthy, often more than 2,000 miles. A monarch is lightweight, but it uses warm air currents to glide. During daytime stops, the butterflies drink nectar and rest in gardens or fields.
- ② The trip can be dangerous. Strong winds may scatter a group, and cold weather can slow the insects. Monarchs cannot migrate successfully without places to refuel. A protected habitat provides flowers, water, and shelter. When forests are destroyed, the butterflies have fewer safe places, so their survival becomes more difficult for the whole population.
- ③ Scientists and community members work together to protect the monarchs' winter homes. In Mexico, people replant native trees where logging has left bare ground. In many towns, residents create pollinator gardens with milkweed, the only plant monarch caterpillars eat. These efforts make the landscape more welcoming, not hostile, for the butterflies during their long stay.
