City Sky Hunters

- ① High above a city street, a peregrine falcon rests on a narrow ledge. The ledge acts like an aerie, or a high nesting place, where the bird can watch the ground below. Although peregrines once became scarce in many places, they have adapted well to tall buildings. From this perch, the falcon can spot pigeons, its usual prey.
- ② When a peregrine hunts, it may climb high into the sky and then fold its wings. Next, it dives in a steep, speedy drop called a stoop. During this plunge, the bird shapes its body to reduce air resistance, the force of air pushing against something moving. A peregrine can reach remarkable speeds, but it must pull up carefully before it reaches the ground.
- ③ People helped peregrines recover by protecting nesting sites and limiting harmful chemicals. Now, some scientists place small bands on young falcons. These bands identify individual birds and help researchers trace their travels. A researcher may observe a banded falcon for years, gathering evidence about its survival and habits. This careful work shows how people and wildlife can share busy urban spaces.

3	What does reduce air resistance mean?	It means make the force of air pushing against the moving bird smaller.
4	What does trace mean in the phrase “trace their travels”? Which words support your answer?	Trace means follow or track where the birds travel. The bands “identify individual birds,” which helps researchers follow them.
