How Beavers Shape Habitats

- ① Beavers are large rodents that live near ponds, streams, and lakes. They use their strong front teeth to cut branches and small trees. First, a beaver carries sticks through the water or drags them across land. Then it piles the sticks with mud and stones. This work creates a dam, which slows moving water and can form a pond.
- ② The new pond can change the area around it. For example, deeper water gives fish, frogs, and ducks places to swim or hide. In addition, the pond may provide water for plants along its edge. Beavers also build lodges from sticks and mud. A lodge has an underwater entrance, so the animals can enter safely when ice covers the pond in winter.
- ③ However, a beaver dam does not help every place in the same way. If water spreads onto a road or farm field, people may need to guide the beavers elsewhere. Even so, many wetlands made by beavers support many living things. Therefore, scientists study beaver ponds to learn how one animal's building work can reshape a habitat.
