A Garden That Catches Rain

- ① At Willow Creek School, students noticed that rainwater rushed across the blacktop and carried soil into a nearby storm drain. The school's garden club wanted to slow the water. First, they studied a rain garden, a shallow planted area that soaks up runoff. Then they asked the principal if they could build one beside the parking lot.
- ② The principal approved the plan, so families donated native plants such as purple coneflowers and sedges. Native plants grow naturally in a region and often need less extra water after they are established. On planting day, students dug the shallow garden and covered bare soil with mulch. Because mulch protects soil from heavy drops, less soil washes away during rainstorms.
- ③ After several storms, the club compared photos of the area. The new garden held puddles for a short time, while the sidewalk no longer had muddy streaks leading to the drain. The students also saw bees visiting the flowers. Their project did not stop every drop of water, but it helped keep soil in place and added a habitat for pollinators.
