Maya's Pollinator Garden

- ① On a warm spring morning, Maya planted a small pollinator garden beside her apartment building. First, she pressed sunflower seeds into the loose soil. Near the fence, she added purple coneflower plants for bees. Then, Maya filled a shallow dish with water and placed smooth stones inside it. The stones gave insects a safe place to land. By lunchtime, her garden was ready for visitors.
- ② During the next week, Maya checked the garden each afternoon. At the edge of the dish, a butterfly rested on a stone. Meanwhile, bees moved from flower to flower, gathering nectar and pollen. After a rainy day, Maya pulled a few weeds from between the plants. As the weeks passed, the garden became brighter and busier. Soon, neighbors stopped to watch the tiny visitors.
- ③ By early summer, the sunflower stems stood taller than Maya's knees. In the center of the garden, yellow blooms opened toward the sun. However, one corner stayed dry because a roof blocked the rain. Maya carried water there in a small can. As a result, the drooping leaves lifted again. Before sunset, she saw two goldfinches pecking seeds from a flower head.
