Maya Revises a Butterfly Paragraph

- ① On Tuesday, Maya watched a monarch butterfly rest on a milkweed plant beside the school garden. Her first draft said only that the butterfly was pretty. When she reread it, she added the orange-and-black wing pattern and the curled tube it used to sip nectar. These details helped readers picture what Maya had seen clearly.
- ② Next, Maya placed her ideas in an order that matched her observation. She began with where the butterfly landed. Then she described its wings and feeding tube. Last, she explained why the milkweed mattered: monarch caterpillars eat milkweed leaves. This order let readers follow her thinking from the first sighting to the reason for the plant.
- ③ Finally, Maya read the paragraph aloud. She heard that two sentences started with "The butterfly," so she changed one beginning to "Its bright wings caught the morning light." She also replaced the vague word "nice" with "sun-warmed" to describe the garden. After these changes, the paragraph had smoother sentences and clearer pictures. Maya kept only details that helped her main idea, a close look at one butterfly.
