Maya Watches Monarchs

- ① At sunset, a naturalist named Maya watched monarch butterflies gather in a meadow. Their orange wings rested on milkweed plants near a quiet creek. Maya used a paper map to trace the route south. She knew the insects would travel far in time before winter brought cold air to the northern fields near her home.
- ② Each morning, Maya recorded the weather in a notebook. A warm breeze could help the butterflies lift above the trees, but heavy rain made flight difficult. One afternoon, she saw a small group settle beside a gravel path. The insects opened and closed their wings as if they were testing the wind before flying away.
- ③ Monarchs need fuel for their long trip, so they sip nectar from many flowers. Maya planted a garden with a purple aster, a yellow tulip, and red zinnias. She also placed a shallow dish of water nearby. By protecting these habitats, people can support monarchs during migration across the continent each autumn and in spring.
