Maya's Wetland Notes

- ② Maya carried a field guide because she wanted to identify the turtle safely. The guide explained that painted turtles often bask in sunlight to warm their bodies. Maya copied the turtle's colors in her notebook, then she sketched the reeds waving beside the water. She stayed quiet so she would not disturb it as it floated.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya was planning to share her notes with the park ranger. She decided to label each drawing and compare it with the guide. Her careful work could help the ranger track turtles during future visits. As Maya walked home, she pictured the turtle resting again when the sun returned to the calm wetland.
