Monarchs on the Move

- ① Each fall, millions of monarch butterflies leave parts of the United States and Canada and travel south. Many eastern monarchs fly to mountain forests in central Mexico, where they spend the winter in large groups. In spring, they begin moving north again. No single butterfly completes the whole round trip, because several generations are born along the way.
- ② Scientists study monarchs by attaching tiny stickers, called tags, to their wings. When a tagged butterfly is found, people can report its code. These reports help researchers trace travel routes. The Monarch Watch program, based at the University of Kansas, organizes tagging projects and collects reports from people who find tagged monarchs in many places.
- ③ Monarch numbers can change from year to year. Habitat loss is one challenge because monarch caterpillars need milkweed plants for food. Adult monarchs also use nectar from flowers. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service explains that planting native milkweed and nectar plants can provide needed resources. The agency's website is one source for information about protecting monarch habitat.
