How Beavers Change Streams

- ① Beavers are known for building dams, but their work changes more than a stream's path. When a beaver piles branches, mud, and stones across moving water, a pond forms behind the dam. The deeper, slower water can spread into nearby low areas. This new pond becomes the center of a small wetland habitat for many animals.
- ② The pond can help many living things. Frogs lay eggs in calm water, and young fish may find shelter among underwater plants. Ducks and herons can feed near the pond's edge. Trees and grasses growing in wet soil offer food and cover to insects, mammals, and birds. By creating several kinds of places to live, beavers increase habitat choices.
- ③ Beaver ponds can also change what happens downstream. A dam slows water during ordinary flows, so some soil carried by the stream settles in the pond instead of rushing farther away. The pond may hold water after rain, releasing it slowly through leaks, channels, or overflow. These changes can reduce erosion in some places, although a dam can also flood land nearby.

Beavers reshape streams by building dams that form ponds. These ponds create wetland homes for frogs, fish, birds, and other animals. Dams also slow water, trap soil, and hold rainwater, which can reduce erosion, though they may flood nearby land.

Accept summaries that state that beaver dams change streams and include accurate support from all three paragraphs. Students may use different details, as long as they explain how those details develop the main idea.
