Peregrine Falcons in the City

- ① On a tall bridge tower, a peregrine falcon watches the river below. The bird is swift, or very fast, when it dives for prey. Its sharp eyes can spot a pigeon from far away, while people on the sidewalk may see only a tiny shape. Although the falcon seems fierce, it usually avoids people and protects its nest quietly.
- ② During spring, a pair may choose a ledge that is sheltered rather than exposed to wind and rain. The parents take turns warming the eggs. One adult leaves to hunt, and the other remains at the nest. After the chicks hatch, their soft down changes slowly into strong flight feathers. The young birds begin close to home, but later travel farther.
- ③ City wildlife workers sometimes place a small band around a falcon's leg. The band does not make the bird tame, or easy to handle. Instead, it helps scientists identify, or recognize, the same bird later. Records show whether a falcon stays in one area or moves to another. By comparing these records, scientists learn which nesting places are safe and which places may be dangerous.
