City Sky Hunters

- ① At dawn, a peregrine falcon perches on a skyscraper ledge above a busy city street. From this lofty lookout, the bird scans for pigeons, its usual prey. Peregrines have sharp vision that helps them notice movement far below. Although the building is made of steel and glass, the narrow ledge resembles the cliff faces where these falcons traditionally nest.
- ② To capture a meal, a falcon may soar high, then fold its wings and plunge in a steep dive called a stoop. During this descent, it can reach very high speeds. The falcon does not crash into its target blindly. It adjusts its path with swift turns, using its tail like a rudder to steer through the air with control.
- ③ City nesting can be hazardous. Windows may reflect the sky, confusing young birds as they learn to fly, and storms can drench an exposed nest. Yet many cities support peregrines by protecting nest sites and placing bands on chicks. A band carries an identifying number, allowing scientists to track where a bird travels and whether it survives.

1	What does lofty mean in paragraph 1? Which detail supports your answer?	Lofty means high above the ground. The falcon is on a ledge above a busy city street.
2	What does traditionally mean in paragraph 1?	Traditionally means in the usual way over a long time, or according to past practice.
3	In paragraph 2, what is a rudder? How does the passage help you understand the word?	A rudder is something used to steer or guide direction. The passage says the falcon uses its tail to steer through the air.
4	What does exposed mean in paragraph 3? Which weather word gives a clue?	Exposed means not protected from the weather. The clue word is "storms," which can drench the nest.
